WEEK 1- A1.1

Unit 1 – Getting to know your classmates better

Communication goal: Introducing yourself, greeting others, and sharing basic personal information.

Language content:

- Verbs ser (to be), llamarse (to be called), tener (to have)
- Countries and nationalities
- Personal pronouns (I, you, he, she)
- Numbers 0-20
- Alphabet and basic pronunciation

Suggested activities:

- Ice-breaker games (bingo, interviews)
- Listening and practicing simple dialogues
- Map activity: "Where are you from?"
- Spelling names and dictations

Final task:

A short oral presentation introducing yourself.

Unit 2 – Why do we want to learn Spanish?

Communication goal: Expressing motivations and goals.

Language content:

- Verbs: study, learn, want
- Purpose expressions (para, porque)
- Professions and occupations

Suggested activities:

- Surveys on motivations
- Role-play interviews
- Poster creation: "My reasons for learning Spanish"

Final task:

Write and present your personal statement.





WEEK 2-A1.2

Unit 3 – Quiz about the Spanish-speaking world Communication goal: Learning basic cultural facts.

Language content:

- Countries, capitals, food, music
- Question words (what, where, who)

Suggested activities:

- Group cultural quiz
- Short presentations

Final task:

Create a visual presentation on a Spanish-speaking country.

Unit 4 – Simulating shopping at a street market

Communication goal: Interacting in buying situations.

Language content:

- Verbs: want, cost, buy
- Clothing, colors, prices
- Numbers 1-100

Suggested activities:

- Buyer-seller roleplays
- Market simulation

Final task:

Participate in a simulated market.

WEEK 3-A1.3

Unit 5 – Introducing or describing friends Communication goal: Describing people.

Language content:

- Verbs ser, tener, gustar
- Physical and personality adjectives

Suggested activities:

- Guessing games
- Describing classmates





Description of a friend or famous person.

Communication goal: Talking about routines.

Language content:

- Routine verbs
- Frequency expressions
- Days of the week

Suggested activities:

- Schedule creation
- Pair interviews

Final task:

Write "A day in my life."

Communication goal: Talking about food and preferences.

Language content:

- Food vocabulary

Suggested activities:

- Designing menus
- Food surveys

Final task:

Present a restaurant menu.

Communication goal: Describing places.

Language content:

- hay (there is/are)
- Places in the city

Suggested activities:

- Drawing maps





Present an ideal neighborhood.

Language content:

- Present perfect
- Job vocabulary

Suggested activities:

- Simulated interviews

Final task:

Choose and present the ideal candidate.

Final task:

Simulate a formal interaction.

Unit 6 – Writing an article about a city

Communication goal: Describing interesting places.

Final task:

Write an article about a city.

Language content:

- Expressions to start/end calls
- Courtesy structures

Final task:

Perform a simulated video call.

Communication goal: Making predictions and hypotheses.

Language content:

- Simple and periphrastic future
- Conditional

Final task:

Prepare a presentation on future predictions.

Unit 8 – Summarizing a movie or a book

Communication goal: Summarizing and giving opinions.

Language content:

- Sequential connectors
- Opinion structures

Final task:

Provide a written and oral summary.

WEEK 1-B1.2.1

Language content:

- Expressions of frequency and degree

Final task:

Present a personal skills infographic.

Unit 2 – Presenting a problem in writing using wishes, complaints, and solutions with the subjunctive

Communication goal: Writing letters/emails describing problems and proposing solutions.

Language content:

- Subjunctive in subordinate clauses
- Vocabulary for complaints and solutions

Final task:

Write a complaint letter using the subjunctive.

WEEK 2-B1.2.2

Unit 3 – Telling anecdotes explaining causes and consequences

Communication goal: Narrating personal anecdotes with causes and results.

Language content:

- Causal and consequential connectors
- Past tenses

Final task:

Present an anecdote including causes and consequences.

Unit 4 – Simulating a discussion expressing feelings and disagreement Communication goal: Expressing emotions, disagreement, and negotiating solutions. Language content:





- Vocabulary for emotions and disagreement
- Subjunctive with emotion verbs

Perform a dramatized discussion.

WEEK 3-B1.2.3

Unit 5 – Describing objects (shape, size, texture, materials)

Communication goal: Describing objects in detail.

Language content:

- Adjectives for shape, size, texture, materials
- Structures: seems to be, is made of, is used for

Final task:

Describe a real or invented object.

Unit 6 – Talking about social issues and proposing solutions

Communication goal: Analyzing social problems and proposing solutions.

Language content:

- Vocabulary: inequality, environment, health, education
- Subjunctive for opinions and suggestions
- Conditional for hypotheses

Final task:

Present a proposal addressing a social issue.

WEEK 4-B1.2.4

Unit 7 – Writing a blog about mysteries using hypotheses and speculation Communication goal: Writing creative blog posts with speculation.

Language content:

- Future and conditional for hypotheses
- Probability markers

Final task:

Write and share a mystery blog entry.

Unit 8 – Reporting what others said in the past

Communication goal: Reporting speech and opinions.





Language content:

- Reported speech in the past
- Changes in pronouns and tenses

Final task:

Prepare an interview or report using reported speech.

LEVEL B2.1 – COURSE PROGRAM

Duration: 4-week intensive course

WEEK 1-B2.1.1

Unit 1 – Reporting a news story and commenting on it

Communication goal: Summarizing and reporting news, expressing opinions.

Language content:

- Reported speech (past)
- Verbs of speech and opinion
- Journalistic vocabulary

Final task:

Write a news story and present commentary.

Unit 2 – Speaking in public: expressing, supporting or rejecting opinions

Communication goal: Participating in structured debates.

Language content:

- Opinion verbs (indicative vs. subjunctive)
- Debate strategies

Final task:

Deliver a formal debate intervention.

WEEK 2-B2.1.2

Unit 3 – Presenting unusual traditions and giving advice





Communication goal: Explaining cultural traditions, expressing wishes.

Language content:

- Subjunctive for wishes/recommendations
- Imperative for advice

Final task:

Create a cultural guide.

Unit 4 – Designing a paradise expressing cause and purpose

Communication goal: Describing ideal places with purpose expressions.

Language content:

- Purpose clauses
- Causal connectors

Final task:

Present an ideal paradise.

WEEK 3-B2.1.3

Unit 5 – Writing a text about a place in the city expressing emotions Communication goal: Describing meaningful places.

Language content:

- Emotional expressions
- Subjunctive for emotions

Final task:

Write and present an emotional description.

Unit 6 – Expressing conditions and requirements to participate in a contest Communication goal: Describing contest rules and conditions.

Language content:

- Conditional clauses (1st and 2nd)
- Modal verbs of necessity

Final task:

Design contest requirements.

LEVEL B2.2 – COURSE PROGRAM

Duration: 4-week intensive course

Schedule: 4 hours per day Total course hours: 80 hours

WEEK 1-B2.2.1

Unit 1 – Describing the body in motion and expressing sensations and emotions Communication goal: Describing physical movements and emotional/physical sensations.

Language content:

- Pronominal verbs of movement and posture
- Body and sensation vocabulary
- Idiomatic expressions

Final task:

Describe a scene with movement and emotion.

Unit 2 – Mediating conflicts and expressing promises in reported speech Communication goal: Mediating conflicts and referencing commitments. Language content:

- Reported speech with verbs: promise, assure, commit
- Vocabulary for negotiation and mediation

Final task:

Act out a mediation case.

WEEK 2-B2.2.2

Unit 3 – Recording a video about legends of a city

Communication goal: Narrating legends through audiovisual media.

Language content:

- Past tenses for narration
- Narrative connectors

Final task:

Record a narrated legend.

Unit 4 – Creating an environmental awareness campaign

Communication goal: Designing campaigns using predictions and warnings.





Language content:

- Future and conditional
- Environmental vocabulary

Final task:

Present an environmental campaign.

WEEK 3-B2.2.3

Unit 5 – Writing a company presentation for a website Communication goal: Writing corporate descriptions.

Language content:

- Business vocabulary
- Present and past tenses

Final task:

Write a company profile.

Unit 6 – Presenting a hypothetical historical event and its consequences Communication goal: Exploring alternative history.

Language content:

- Past conditional and third conditional
- Expressions of criticism and consequence

Final task:

Present an alternative-history scenario.

Duration: 8-week intensive course

Schedule: 4 hours per day
Total course hours: 160 hours

WEEK 1-C1.1

Communication goal: Analyzing linguistic phenomena and explaining their evolution.

Language content:

- Resources for nuanced argumentation
- Metalinguistic vocabulary
- Logical connectors

Final task:

Oral presentation with visual support.

WEEK 2-C1.2

Unit 2 – Presenting "the song of your life" with evocative memories Communication goal: Evoking personal memories tied to a meaningful song. Language content:

- Verbs of perception and memory
- Combined past tenses

Final task:

Written or oral presentation.

WEEK 3-C1.3

Unit 3 – Podcast about a conspiracy theory using irony

Communication goal: Creating humorous and ironic podcast scripts.

Language content:

- Irony and hyperbole
- Hypothetical conditionals

Final task:

Record a podcast.

WEEK 4-C1.4





Unit 4 – Talking about life stages and the passage of time

Communication goal: Reflecting on life stages.

Language content:

- Vocabulary for biography and personal development
- Periphrases of change

Final task:

Autobiographical presentation.

WEEK 5-C1.5

Unit 5 – Creating a forum on misunderstandings and discussing humor Communication goal: Sharing experiences and analyzing humor.

Language content:

- Vocabulary for humor and misunderstandings
- Colloquial discourse markers

Final task:

Moderate a forum.

WEEK 6-C1.6

Unit 6 – Writing an ordinance regulating the use of a public space Communication goal: Producing regulatory documents.

Language content:

- Impersonal and passive structures
- Legal vocabulary

Final task:

Write a complete ordinance.

WEEK 7-C1.7

Unit 7 – Presenting an exhibition or museum room

Communication goal: Delivering guided tours.

Language content:

- Artistic and cultural vocabulary
- Rhetorical devices

Final task:

Oral presentation of an exhibition.

WEEK 8-C1.8

Unit 8 – Designing a gastronomic experience

Communication goal: Creating an innovative gastronomic proposal.

Language content:

- Sensory and gastronomic vocabulary
- Evaluative structures

Final task:

Present a creative gastronomic experience.

Language content:

- Urban planning vocabulary

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Level C2 consolidates and perfects advanced linguistic competence. Students learn to communicate with total fluency, precision, and stylistic versatility in any context—academic, professional, cultural, or social.

MAIN COMPETENCE AREAS

- 1. Oral Expression:

- Participation in debates and formal presentations
- Use of humor, irony, and cultural references
